Cost

Due to the costs involved in running the enrichment programme, we are requesting a voluntary contribution of £15 from every student involved in the programme. This will enable us to continue to utilise external agencies and to provide resources for those in house activities, to ensure all students receive a high-quality experience on Wednesday afternoons. The voluntary contribution will appear as a payment item on Parent Pay, with a deadline of 31st October 2025; this is a one-off cost for the academic year 2025/26.

Due to the nature of some activities on offer, there may be requests for further voluntary contributions; for example those activities that go off site or , utilise external instructors. Any additional voluntary contributions will be requested from the activity leader via school email.





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Students will be allocated up to 6 different activities over the course of the year; they will be allocated at least 1 activity from each of the categories below. This will ensure that students have more variety with their allocation.

Sport

The activities in the SPORT category are all sports and physical activities. Be prepared to work hard, get fitter and learn new skills.

Creative

The activities in the CREATIVE category, all require you to use your creativity in different ways, from designing, to acting, to singing and painting.

Cultural

The activities in the CULTURAL category will improve your skills and knowledge in a range of areas such as debating, film and science.

Employability

The activities in the EMPLOYABILITY category, are all activities that will give you the opportunities to add to your CV, from learning an new language to first aid.



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Cumbrian

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Award

The Cumbrian Award was first introduced a number of years ago in response to both the increasingly academic and narrow curriculum path which many schools felt they were being driven down, and the recognition that many children and young people did not value their identity as Cumbrians, did not actively engage in the tremendous opportunities the county has to offer, and that in turn, the county does to benefit from or maximise the potential that younger generations represent. It aims to enhance the skill set and give students the opportunity to apply such skills in a range of environments – whether that be navigating a Lakeland fell, negotiating a boardroom meeting or performing on a theatre stage... and beyond.

The Cumbrian Award is supported by and delivered with WELL and is recognised as an enriching and inspiring opportunity for young people in Cumbria.

This year, some enrichment activities can contribute towards students achieving elements of the Cumbrian Award.

Adventure Enterprise Culture

Students have time to complete the award; its not something that is to be done within a year. During their time at Millom School, students can engage and participate in a range of different activities, with a view of achieving the Cumbrian Award by the time they are ready to leave Millom School.

The Cumbrian Award, is another additional, accredited achievement students at Millom School can strive to achieve, aiding future post 16 and post 18 pathways.

Look out for the activities, which may contribute towards achieving this.





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You will pick 3 activities from each category.

How will it work?

You will be allocated 1 activity from each category and 2 activities from your remining choices.

Activity Choices

All activities chosen will be considered when allocating; you must be prepared to participate in ALL your activity choices. Activities are not ranked when you select them.

All activity information will be on the enrichment notice board and sent to tutors, along with information on equipment/kit needed, staff and meeting points. Students MUST check the enrichment board.

You will have until **6th June** to submit the form. You can complete the form at home or in school.

All activities have min numbers, if this isn't met, the activity will not run.

Activities that are oversubscribed, will only run with their max numbers. In this case, students activity choices over the year will be taken into consideration
