Mrs Vance's Year 9 Science class have been attempting to determine the mass of soluble and insoluble substances in samples of water using techniques of filtration and crystallisation.



Science with Mrs Vance

Mrs Vance's Year 9 Science class have been preparing samples of their own cheek cells and onion cells for viewing under the microscope.

Methylene blue stain is used to stain the animal cell sample—it makes DNA in the nucleus of the cell viable (blue dot in the middle of the round cell). The class used iodine to stain the cell samples. Iodine makes the plant cell walls visible.


It was interesting to note that plant cells are rectangular in shape and are closely packed together, whereas animal cells are much more rounded with spaces between them.


For their GCSE required practical the students had to also complete a biological drawing of the sample and work out the actual size of the cell using the microscopes magnification. Some of the samples viewed were magnified at x440.

Year 8 Humanities Visit to Muncaster Castle and Ravenglass

Year 8 all enjoyed their visit to Muncaster Castle and Ravenglass this term. The students enjoyed the castle tour where they learnt about the History of the castle from its Roman origin through the improvements in the medieval period to the present day. The highlight of the historical journey being the time that Henry VI was taken in by the Pennington family and cared for before returning to London, for this kindness the King gave the Pennington family a glass bowl and the promise that if the bowl remined in the castle the family would experience prosperity and good health, today the bowl remains hidden in the castle with only two members of the family knowing its location.

In the portrait gallery the group looked at pictures of a long line of Pennington's' and learnt about their contribution to the castle and its upkeep. In the 1950's Mrs Pennington introduced a bear bought at Harrods Castle, after the purchase of another bear many baby bears followed, the bear pit remained until the 1980's, the current Meadow Vole Maze occupies what remains of the old bear pit.

Despite the weather pupils enjoyed the new adventure playground at Yetiquarry and the rope swing in the tree tops. Due to the rain on week one lunch was eaten in the Old Laundry, whilst one week pupils enjoyed picnicking on the lawns outside of the castle.

The day was ended with a nice walk of 1.5 miles to the settlement of Ravenglass, its Roman origins are obvious with the bath house coming into view as we entered the village.

Geographically, strategic this perfect harbour was one of the empires most northernly ports. Here the River Esk, Mitre and Irt enter the sea behind the beautiful sand dunes that protect the harbour from the strong westerly winds during the winter months.

Students completed work in Ravenglass looking at the housing and trying to distinguish the number of holiday homes and how this affects the services and prices in the village. We did manage to interview a few local residents and holiday makers but it was pretty quiet.

Covid Reminders
